While Wasatch County is providing an emergency notification system and the self-registration portal, responsibility for signing up and maintaining up to date contact information is the responsibility of the resident.

EVERBRIDGE

Our Emergency Notification System is powered by Everbridge.

An Emergency Notification System is a communication tool that utilizes a database of communication paths (phone numbers, email addresses, etc.), and property addresses, which are associated with GIS mapping technologies to deliver emergency notifications to the community.

Using emergency notification technologies, emergency officials can quickly target a geographic area and potentially reach thousands of residents and property owners in a short period of time.

Emergency notifications include the following:

- Hazardous Materials Spills
- Evacuations
- Wildfires
- Flooding
- Crime
- Boil Water Advisories
- Other Critical Notifications

Residents with land-based phone lines (Century Link or All West) are automatically subscribed to receive this

service. They will receive emergency alerts only via their land-based phone lines.

Wasatch County residents and property owners with or without land-based phone lines may register multiple addresses (home, business, schools, cabins, etc.) for alerts using our web-based registration portal and provide Wasatch County with their desired alert communication paths and the desired call order for these paths. In addition to emergency alerts, you are able to sign up for community (non-emergency) alerts and information if desired.
